



Traditional Saltillo

Traditional Saltillo tiles come in a wide range of terracotta colors. You will find tones from red and orange, to yellow and gold. Unsealed tiles reflect lighter and pastel shades as seen on the backside of your samples.

Manganese Saltillo

Manganese Saltillo tiles come in many warm shades. The Manganese finish tends to be light to dark brown in color with terracotta color undertones. Some tiles can have black swirling that creates a marbling effect.

Spanish Mission Red Saltillo

Looking for more consistency in color? Spanish Mission Red is similar to the Traditional color but has minimal light tones due to the effect of the Mission Red dye added to the sealer. These floors display a darker range of terracotta colors.

Antique Saltillo

Antique Saltillo tiles have the appearance of reclaimed terracotta. These are hand-textured with a blend of rust and terracotta colors. The textured surface makes Antique Saltillo ideal for areas requiring a non-slip surface or rustic look.
